BLACK, HENRY, a thrifty farmer, of Whetstone Hollow, Dayton, Columbia County, Wash., was born in Kentucky in 1819, being the fourth of eight children born to John and Sarah (Myers) Black. His parents were natives of Virginia. Young Black, after the average amount of desultory school education, where the hours of field work exceeded those of study, which in those early days fell to the lot of farmers' boys, left home at the age of eighteen, going to Jackson County, Mo., where he remained two years. In 1840 he crossed the plains, travelling by mule teams, with the American Fur Company traders as far as Whitman Station. From thence he journeyed alone to Oregon, and a short time later went to California in the Government employ. Returning to Oregon, he took up a claim near Portland, and lived on it thirty-seven years. Removing to Columbia County (then Walla Walla), he settled in 1878 on the farm which he still owns and cultivates. He has five hundred and forty acres, growing all kinds of grain, a splendid orchard, loaded in its season with many kinds of fruit, ample barns, and a spacious residence. He was married in 1848 to Mary A., daughter of Alexander Thackeray, a well-to-do farmer of Oregon. Twelve children have been born to them. Mr. Black is a member of the Masonic fraternity, and in politics affiliates with the Republican Party.

Another of the early settlers in the Whetstone station area was Henry C. Black. A son <sup>67</sup>John and daughter split the land when their father died. John married Sara White. He died from injuries received when a pile of sacked wheat fell on him but Sara proved up on their claim and got a patent in 92. She married Elijah McCall, who had homesteaded near by.

A son of the John Blacks, also named John, married Irene Stovall. They had a family of twelve children - Claud (Curley), Marion, Cleta (Winnett), Hilda, John D., Jack, Mary, Virginia, Billie, Charles, Jimmie and Charline. Claud married Mildred Vannice and Cleta married Cub Winnett. Their son Richard is a partner in the Valley Vision Clinic in Walla Walla. Curley and Cleta's families were the only ones to remain in Columbia County.

Dan and Jim Black were from another Black family. Dan got a patent on a homestead in 1902. Jim's son Cecil bought the Nickols place in 1931 at probate sale. His wife Lora died in 34 leaving a daughter Cecelia, age six. He remarried but died several years ago. His widow Margaret still owns and lives on the place. The abstract of title refers to the right-of-way deeded to the Washington and Columbia River Railway Co. (now Union Pacific) in 1900 when work was progressing on the Dayton - Covello extension.

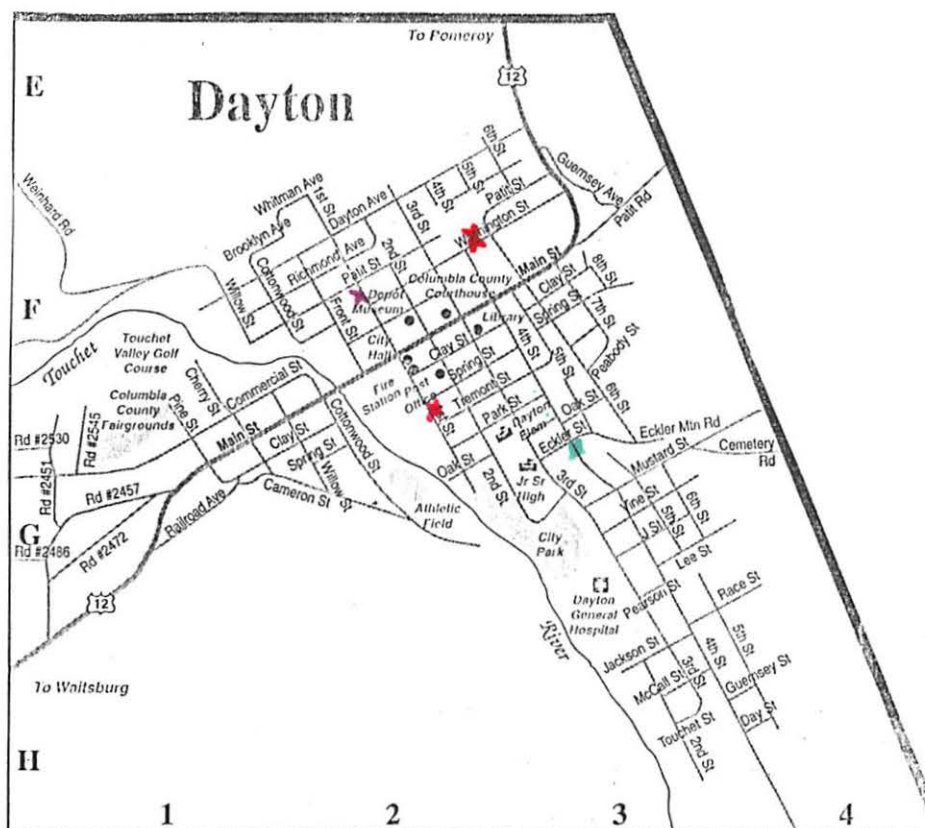

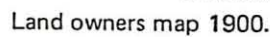
### FORMER RESIDENT HERE

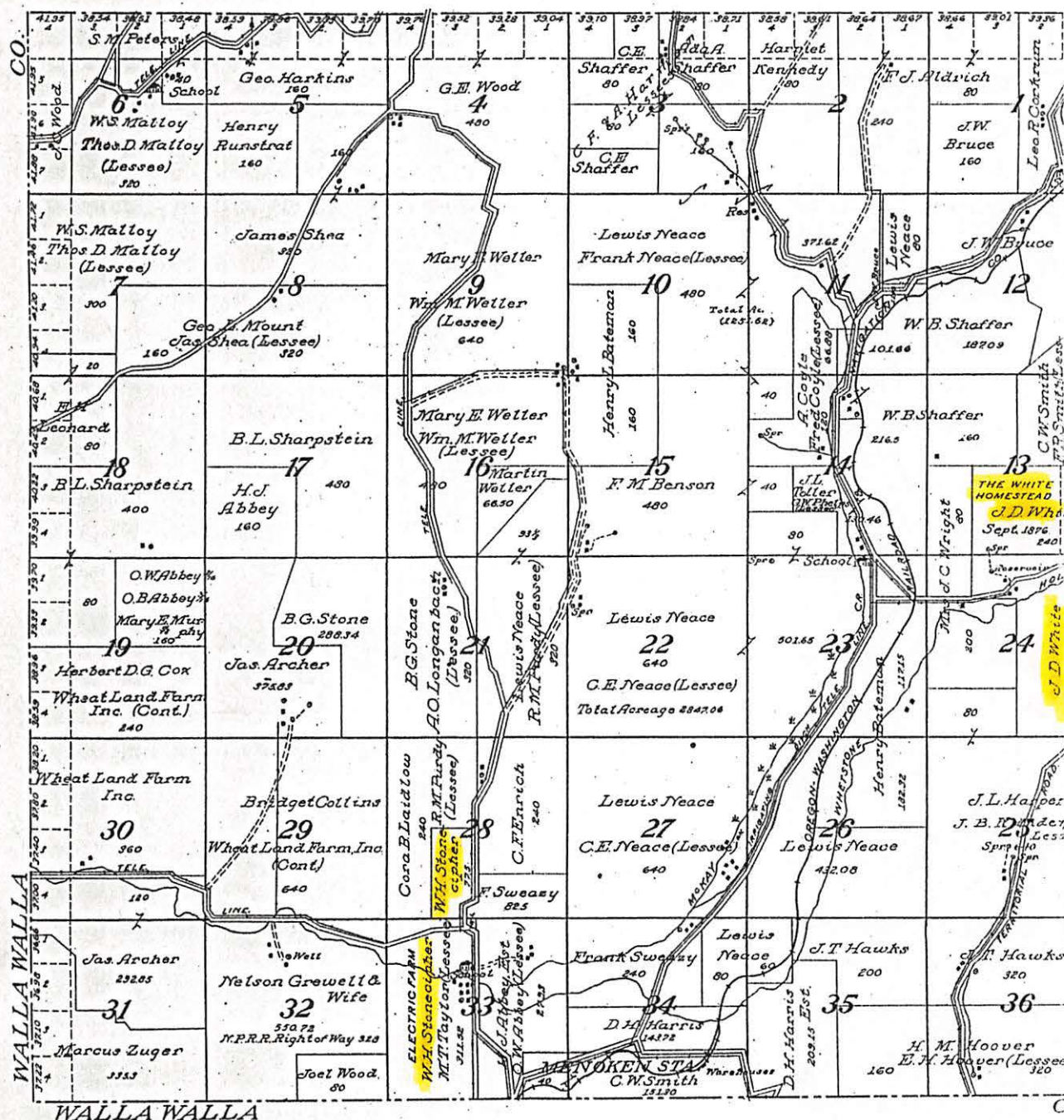


# MAP OF

### OF THE WILLAMETTE MERIDIAN

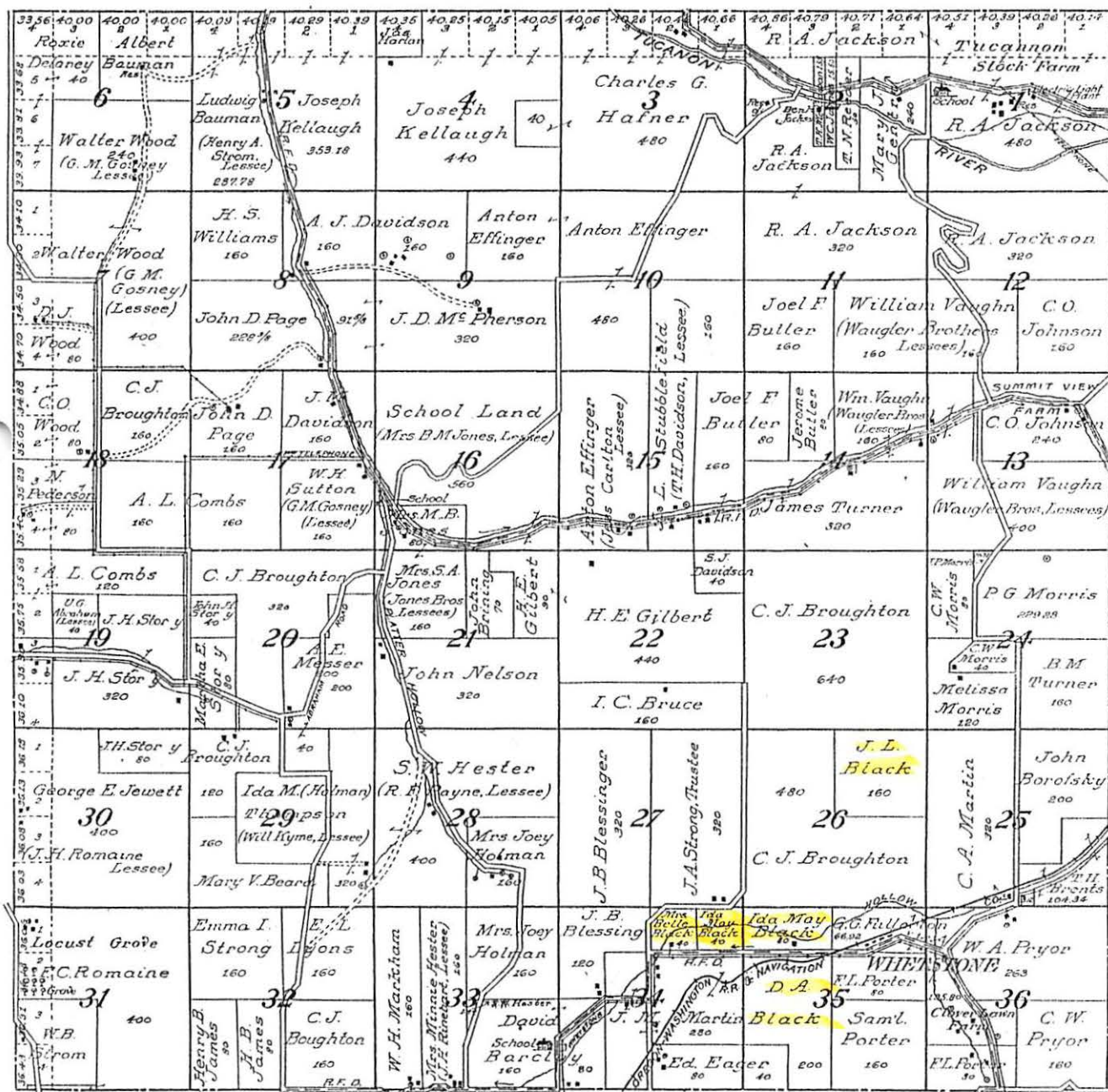

Cläud married Mildred Vannice and Cleta married Cub Winnett. Their son Richard is a partner in the Valley Vision Clinic in Walla Walla. Curley and Cleta's families were the only ones to remain in Columbia county.

Dan and Jim Black were from another Black family. Dan got a patent on a homestead in 1902. Jim's son Cecil bought the Nickols place in 1931 at probate sale. Hisrwife Lora died in 34 leaving a daughter Cecelia, age six. He remarried but died several years ago. His widow Margaret still owns and lives on the place. The abstract of title refers to the right-of-way deeded to the Washington and Columbia River Railway Co. (now Union Pacific) in 1900 when work wasprogressing on the Dayton -Covello estension.

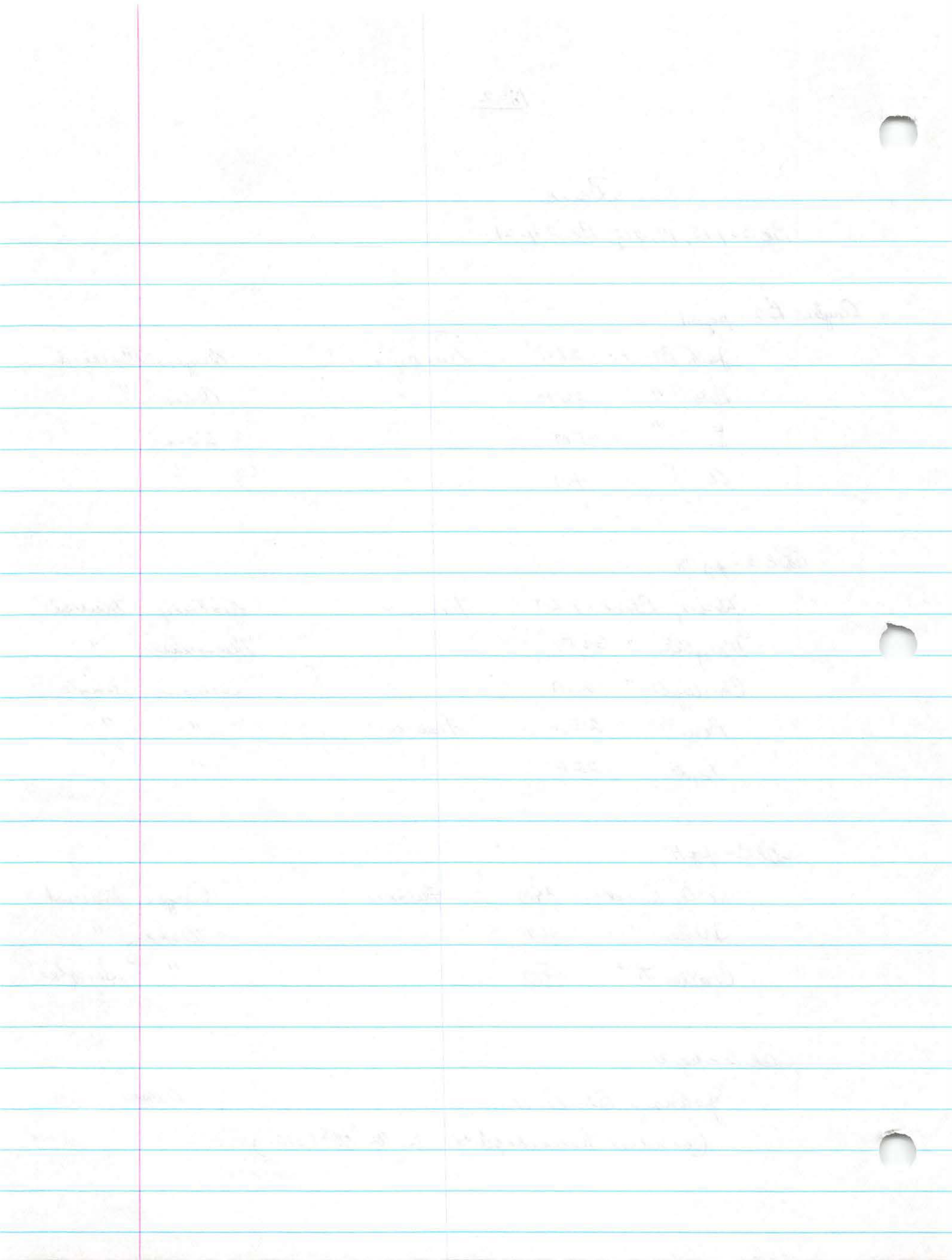

Jim was one of the 12 sons and daughters of Mrs. Irene Black and the late John Black.

Jim had been to Walla Walla to pick up some machinery parts for an overhaul job being done on county equipment. He was on his way home when he came into the curve at the site of the accident and hit an icy piece of road. He lost control of the pickup and in one of its gyrations to made about a 75 per cent headon contact with the tanker outfit.

The front running gear of the tanker outfit was knocked out from under it and the pickup jammed under in its place. The pickup cab badly crushed was pushed back to the rear end of the pickup. It had been to Walla Walla to pick up some machinery parts for an overhaul job being done on county equipment. He was on his way home when he came into the curve at the side of the accident and hit an icy place of road. He lost control of the pickup and in one of its gyrations to make about a 90 per cent hard corner back with the tanker outfit.

The front running gear of the tanker outfit was hooked out from under it and the pickup jammed under in its place. The pickup cab badly crumpled was pushed back to the rear end of the pickup. Reports reaching Layton are somewhat conflicting. One report was that tank was crumpled in the wreckage; the other is that he was thrown clear and landed on the roadside shoulder.

The pickup was totally destroyed; a mass of twisted and mangled junk.

The tanker out fit was that of Howard Williams, according to State Patrolman Norton Ober, who investigated, and was driven by Ralph Moore, one time resident of Layton. Moore suffered a "bleeding" and was taken to a Walla Walla hospital.

The affair is a very sad one and the parents and relatives of the deceased have the sympathy of the entire people. Ben was a quiet, good boy, whose physical afflictions have been such a severe trial for him that in order to be relieved from pain he finally resolved on self destruction. Next he was in the quartermaster's department and went there to assist in erecting buildings for General Sherman and was there until the war closed. He was given fifteen men on one occasion to take General Sherman's mail from Wilmington, North Carolina, to Fayetteville.
