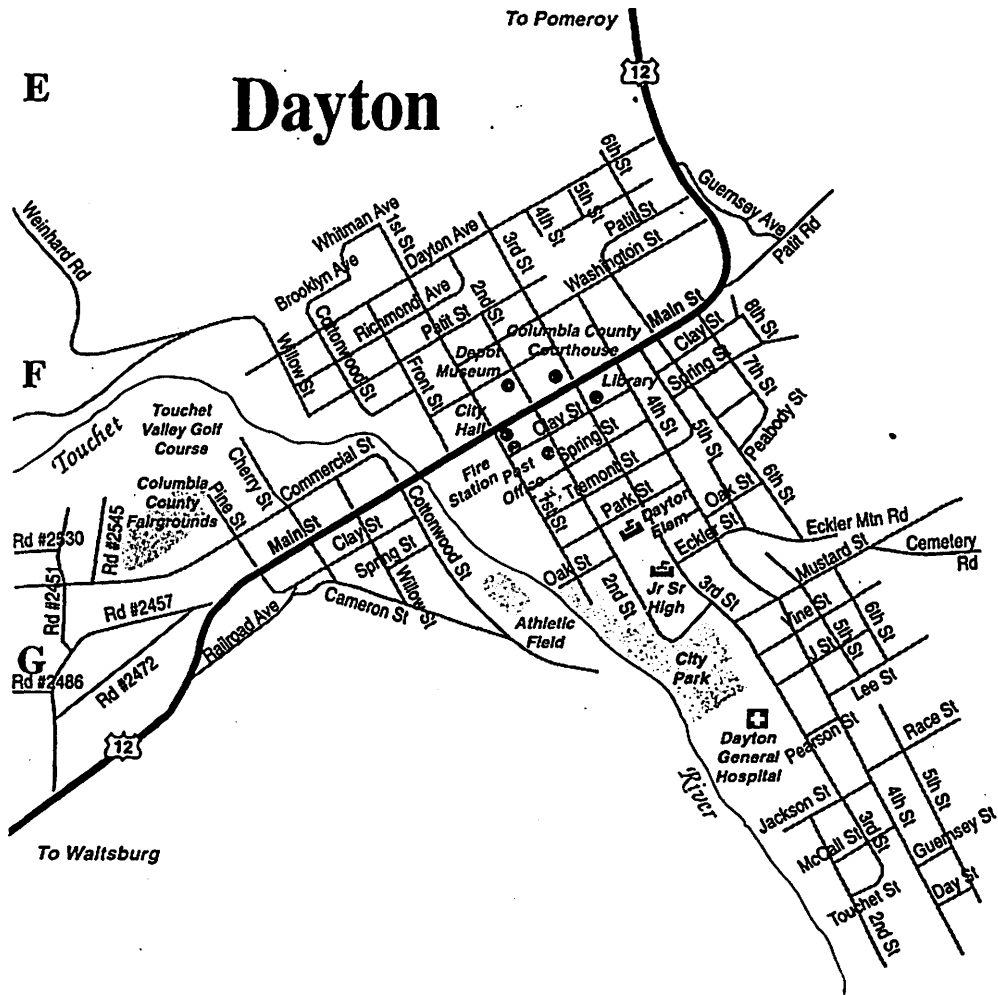

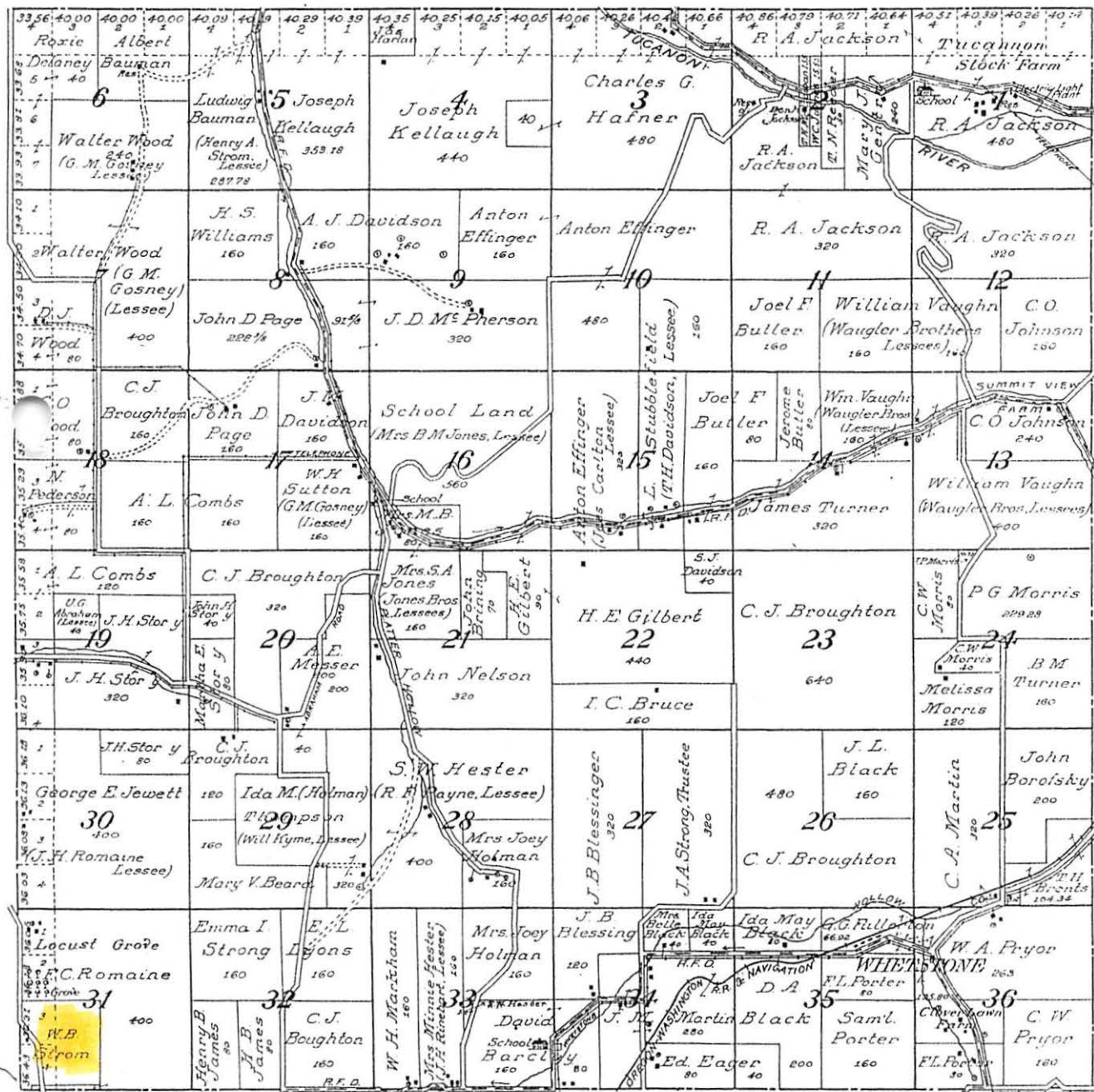
Strom Henry A farmer r 1/4 mile w of city

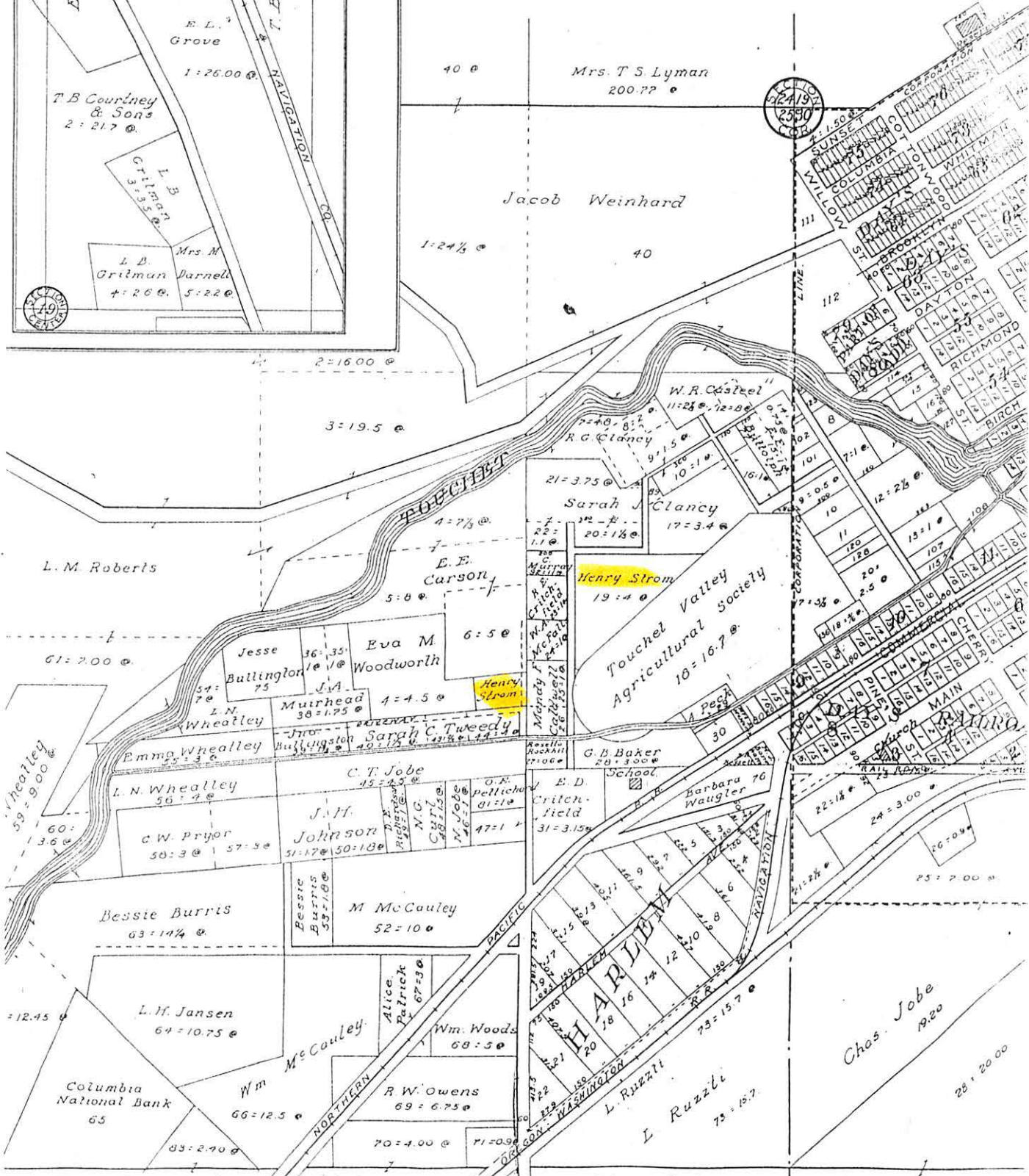

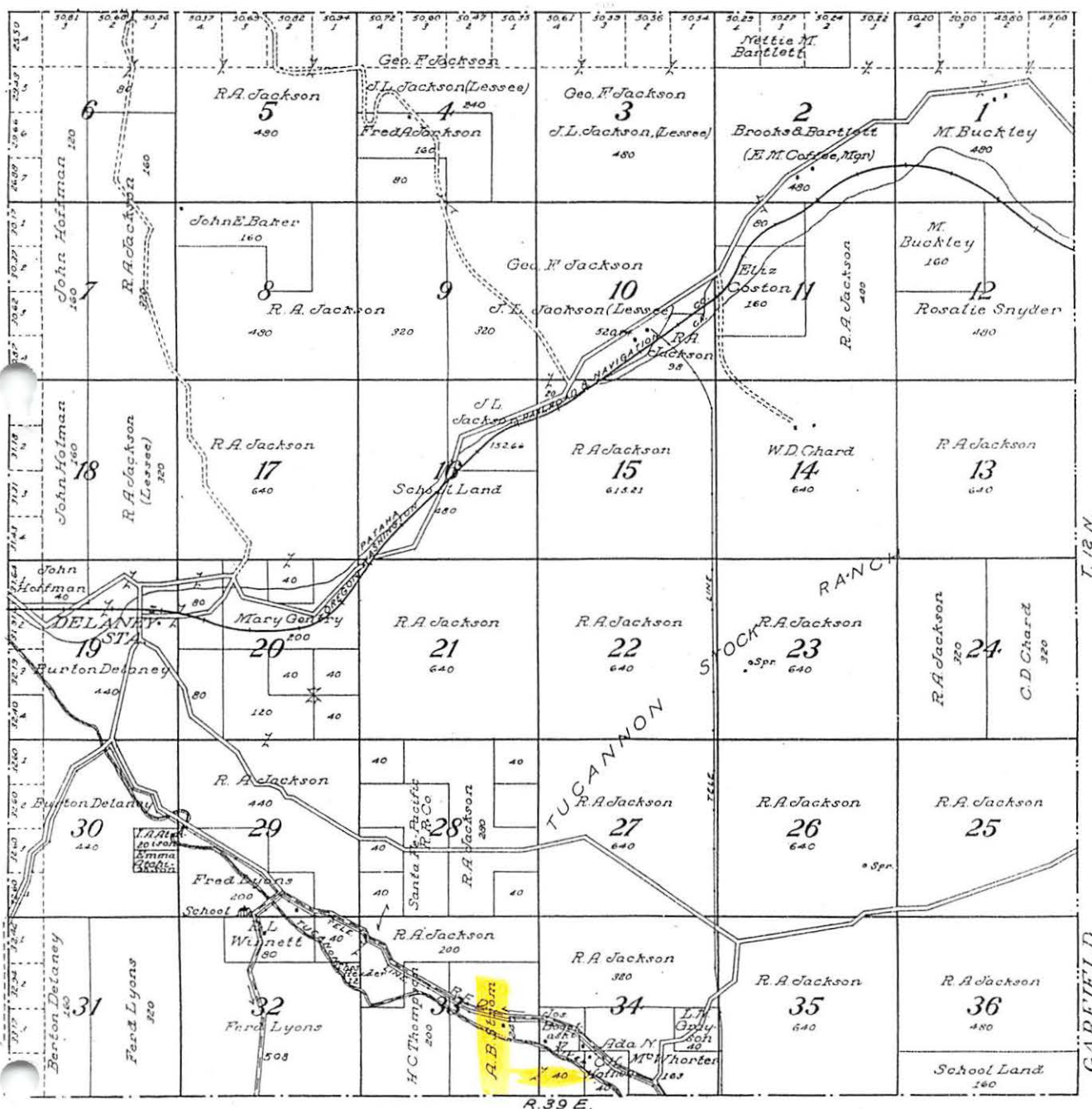

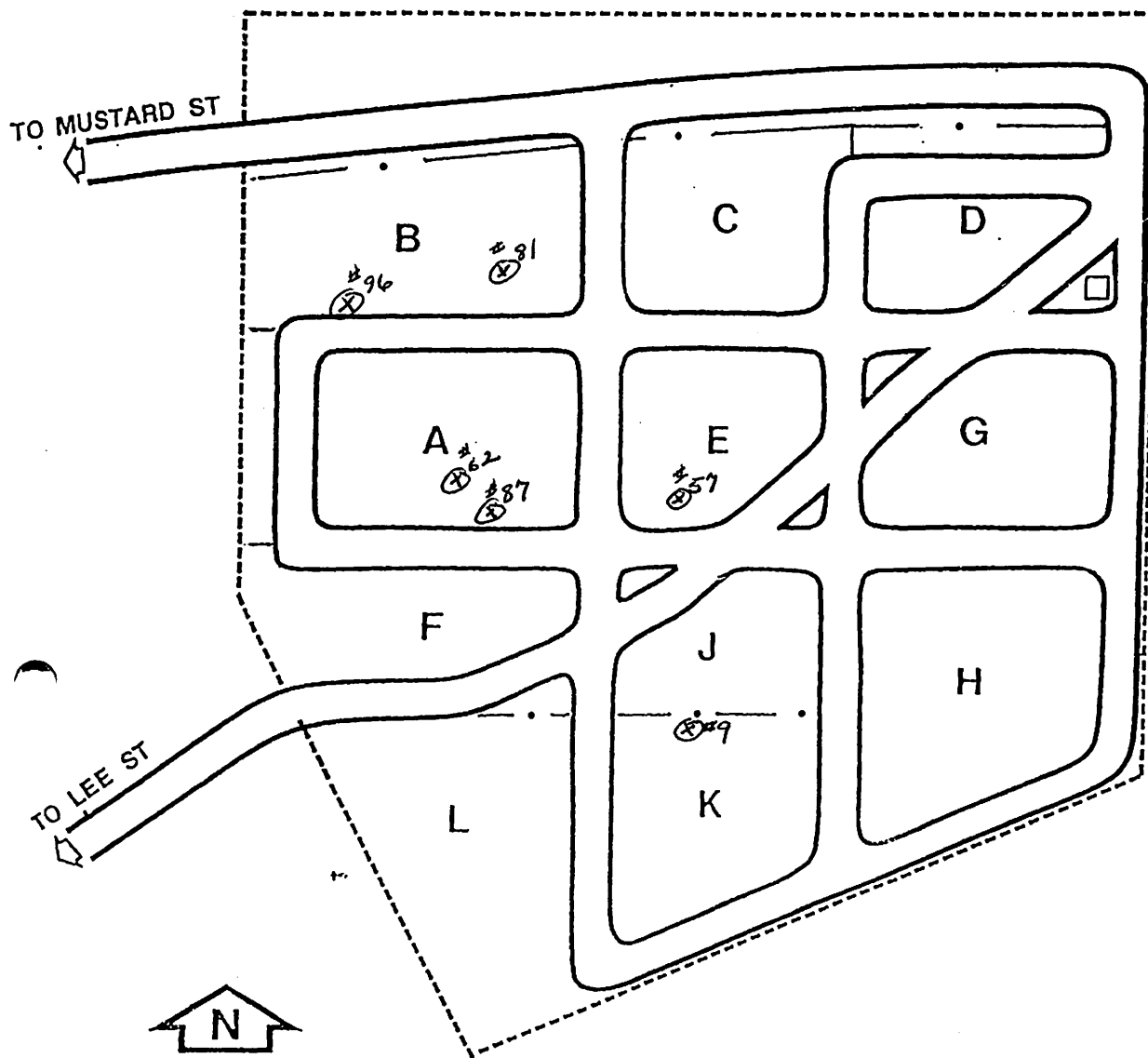

J. U. STRAHM.

At a period when the government owned most of the land in Washington and the work of progress and development seemed scarcely begun, J. U. Strahm and his wife came to Walla Walla county and cast in their lot with its pioneer settlers. They here underwent many of the hardships and privations incident to establishing a home on the frontier, but with resolute spirit they met all these and in the course of years came to enjoy the comforts of modern day civilization. Mr. Strahm was born in Switzerland, July 30, 1827, and was but six years of age when brought to America by his parents, the family home being established in Ohio. They afterward removed to Iowa and in 1849 J. U. Strahm removed to California, attracted by the discovery of gold on the Pacific coast. There he remained for three years, after which he returned to Missouri, where in 1864 he was united in marriage to Miss Mary Jane Farley, a daughter of Harvey and Elizabeth (Bruett) Farley, the former a native of Ohio, while the latter was born in Indiana. The father was killed while serving as a soldier in the Civil war and the mother afterward passed away in Tennessee.

Following their marriage Mr. and Mrs. Strahm resolved to try their fortune in the far west and made their way across the country to Walla Walla county, where he took up a homestead near Dixie. There was little to indicate the wonderful changes which were still to occur as the white settlers penetrated into this region and reclaimed its rich resources for the purposes of civilization. The greater part of the land was still unclaimed and uncultivated and the most far-sighted could scarcely have dreamed of what the future held in store for this rich district. Mr. Strahm became actively identified with its farming interests and bent his energies to the development of his place, bringing his fields under a high state of cultivation and therefore annually gathering rich harvests.

To Mr. and Mrs. Strahm were born fourteen children, eleven of whom are now living: Ann J., the widow of John Byrd; William H., who is deceased; Elizabeth, the wife of John Glynn; Rosa D., the wife of Tom Hastings; Mary E., the wife of Eldon Buroker; Nora J., the wife of Joel Chitwood; John E.; Nannie V., who is the wife of Alfred Brown; Lucretia R., the wife of Alvin McElvain; Viola, the wife of Fred Wells; Edna, at home; Alma B., the wife of Jene Green; and two who are deceased.

The death of Mr. Strahm occurred February 11, 1895, at which time his remains were interred in the Dixie cemetery. He had been a devoted husband and father and had put forth every possible effort to aid in promoting the welfare and happiness of his family. His widow still occupies the old homestead, having eighty acres in her farm near Dixie, and the careful development and improvement of the property insures to her a substantial annual income.

Mr. Byrd was born in Independence county Arkansas, Sept. 21st, 1850, and came to Oregon in an early day with his parents, where he resided till the year 1872, when in company with the family of his brother-in-law, Mr. John Blessinger, he emigrated to this state. On Nov. 26 1890, he was married to Miss Josephine Strahm, of Dixie, Walla Walla county. Miss Strahm was one of the many very successful teachers in the public schools in this and Walla Walla county. His wife and four children now survive him.

It can truthfully be said of John Byrd, that none knew him, but to respect him. He was a plain, unassuming man; one who never aspired to any form of public life nor sought notoriety in any way. He was best loved where best known, and and that was inside his own home circle. It is there his absence will be most felt. In vain will aching hearts listen for dear familiar footsteps that come no more. May He who noteth even the sparrows fall, bring comfort and consolation to the loved ones he left behind.

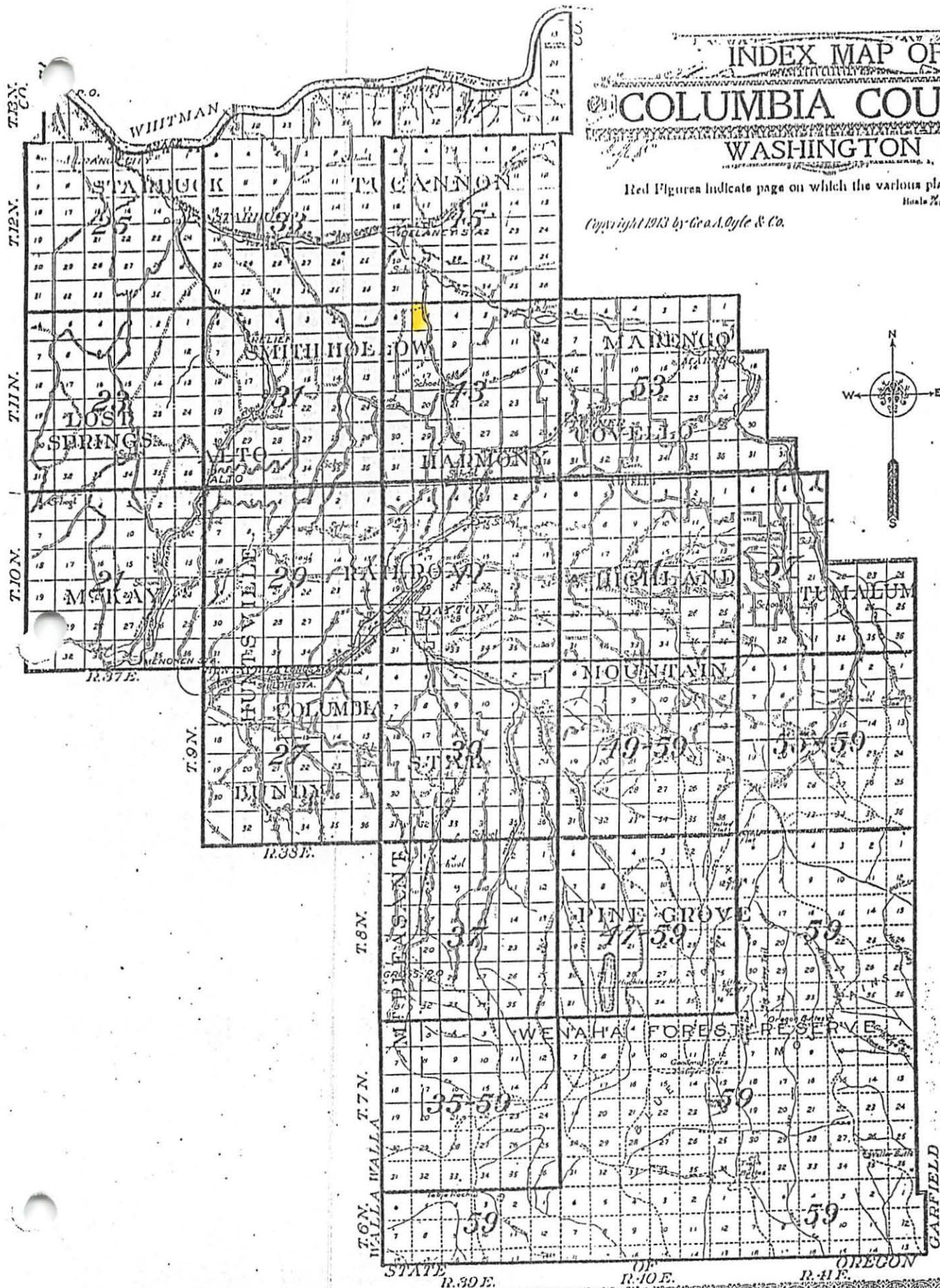
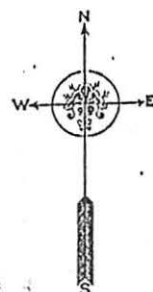

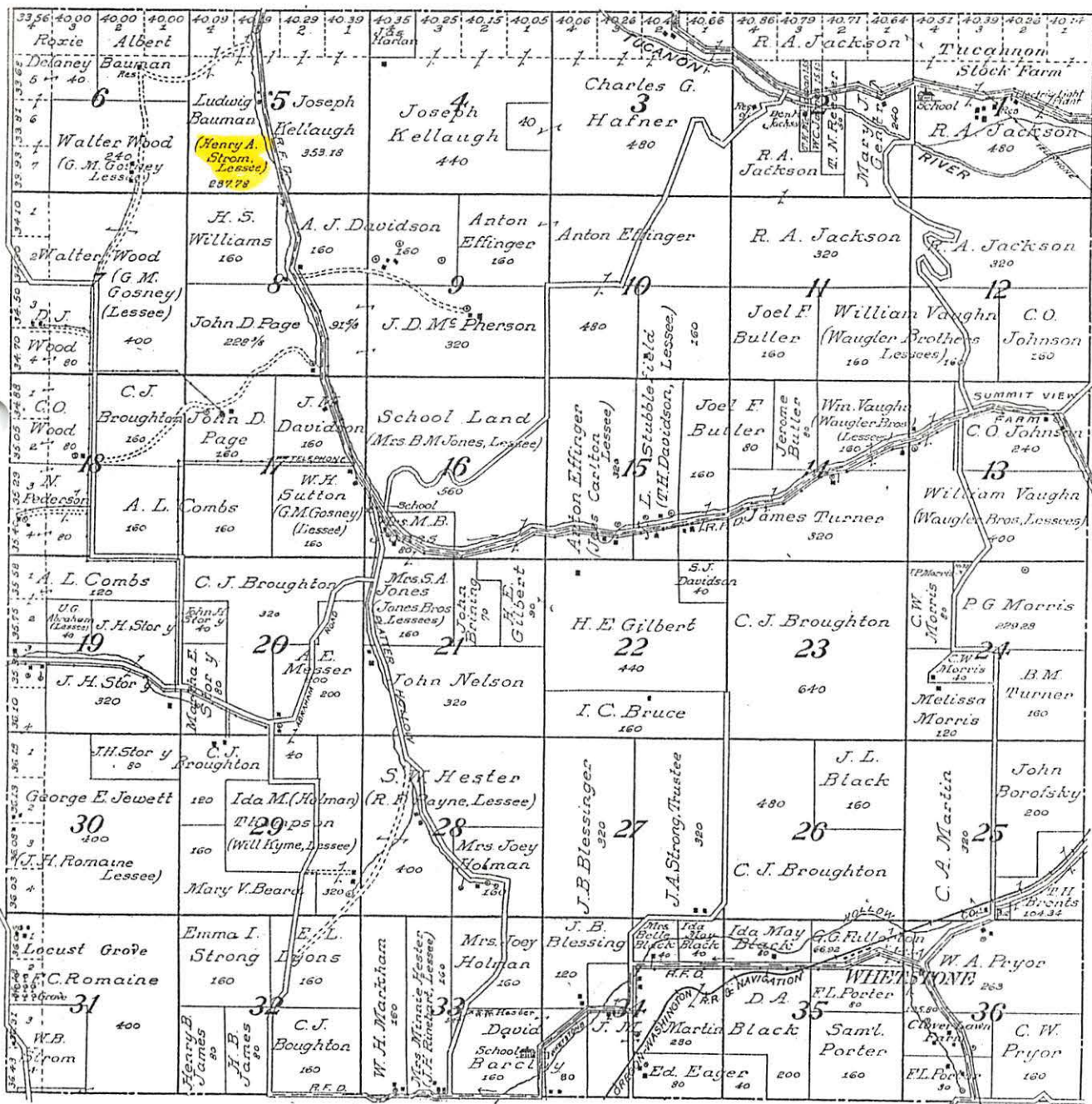


# MAP OF

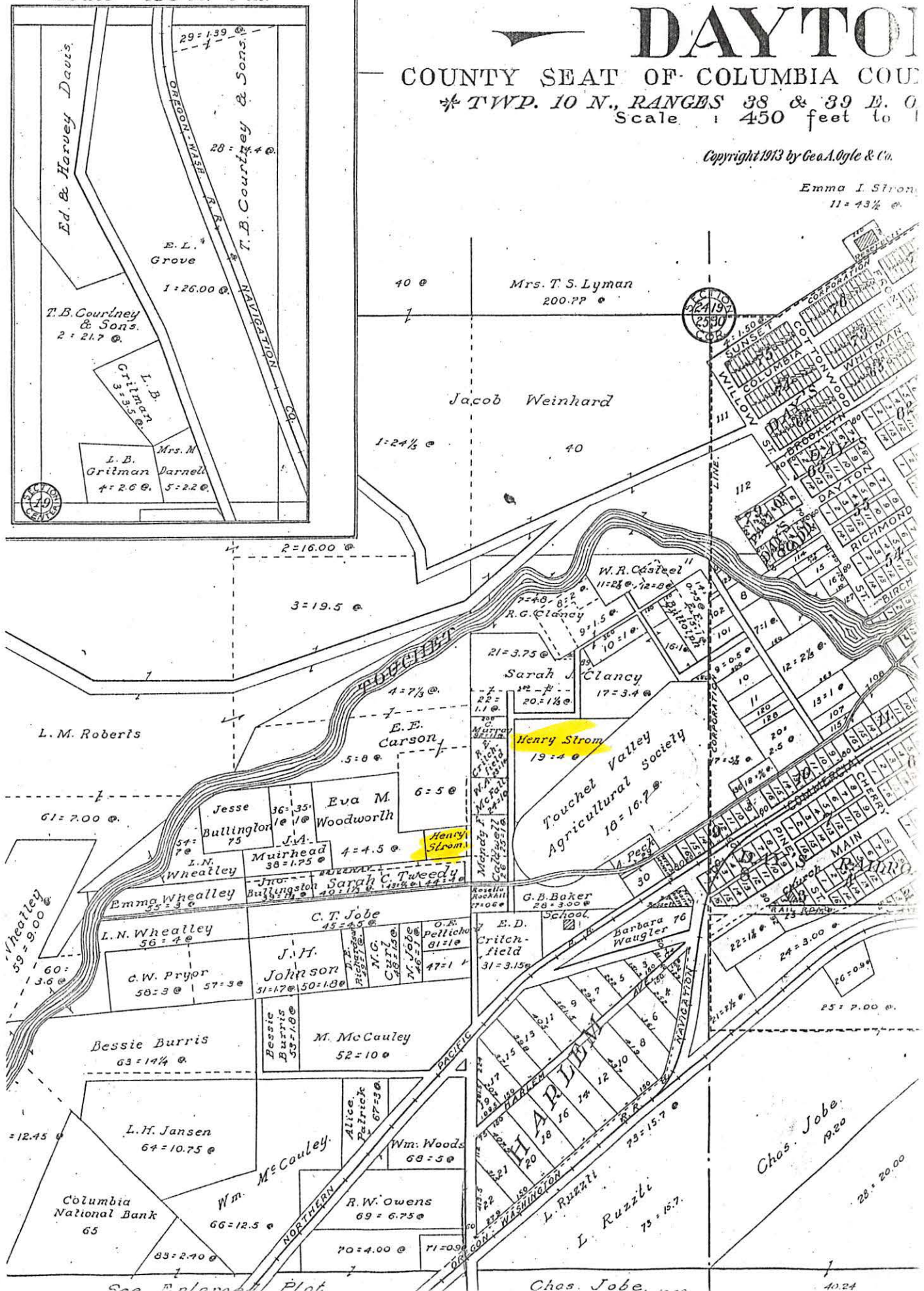

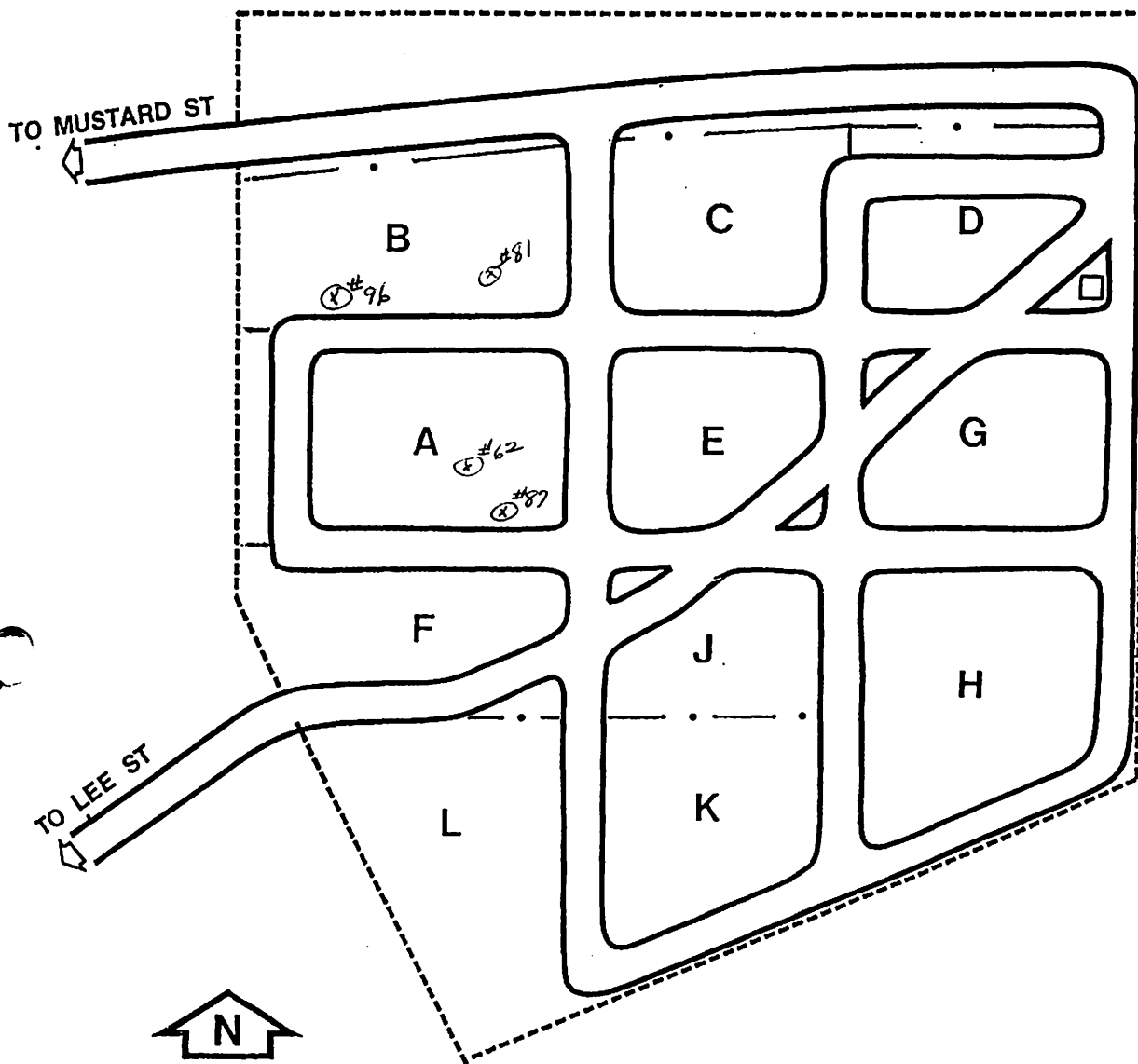

# FORTY YEARS WEDDED.

Thursday evening, of this week was the fortieth anniversary of the marriage of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Strohm, of this city.

On Dec. 6, 1854, at Cooksville, Welland county, Ontario, Mr. Samuel Strohm and Miss Sarah Stringer were married. Four years the young couple lived in that vicinity and then moved to Maquoketa, Iowa. Eleven years later to Nebraska, 16 years later to Colorado and after 2 years there, moved to Dayton. Thirty of the forty years they have been married has been spent on the frontier, amid innumerable hardships. They have lived in many sections of country, in moving from one coast to the other, but like best of all Dayton and the people thereof.

The Dayton Band surprised the old people Thursday evening by serenading them. Indeed, anniversaries with them have become so ordinary that neither one thought of it until the band appeared. However, their fortieth anniversary was one of the most pleasant ever experienced by them. Mr. and Mrs. Strohm can relate many interesting and curious stories of life on the plains in early days.

When they first went to Nebraska they settled at Camden, then the most pretentious town in the state and a candidate for capital city honors. There was a flouring mill, hotel and many stores there then. During the winter of '69 a band of Pawnee Indians stopped over night on their way home from a friendly visit with the Omahas. Their chief died that night and then followed a weird death dance, which the entire population of the village turned out to witness. When it came to burying the chief, the tribe proposed to wrap him up in his blankets and place the body in a tree on a hill almost in the center of the town. The citizens prevailed upon the tribe to place the body in a box, which was done. The chief's horse was killed, his beads, daggers, blankets, etc. placed in the box and the whole business, with the saddle on top, stuck up in the tree. When spring came the stench from the body was something frightful, and it became a question of either moving the Indian or the town. Word was sent to the governor asking what should be done. The answer came back: "Bury the body."

Accordingly the influential citizens proceeded to imbibe some of Hostetter's nerrvine and then tackled the dead Indian. A grave was dug and the body taken down. Old man Dole had furnished the lumber to make the coffin with, the winter before, and had never received any pay for it. He insisted, therefore, that the body be dumped out, and he carried the box home and made a cupboard out of it. Hayden, the M. D. of the town walked off with the saddle and other prominent citizens pocketed daggers, beads and numerous trinkets. When the tribe returned they exhumed the body and finding the trinkets gone, were very wroth. The citizens began immediately to get rid of their purloined trinkets, casting them into the river, burying and burning them. The Indians swore vengeance, threatening to burn the town and massacre the citizens. For two weeks a reign of terror ensued, every man went armed and someone was con-

stantly kept watching to give the alarm in case of attack. Finally the matter was adjusted by the Indians agreeing to peacefully depart if given a certain number of meals at Roper's hotel. Their proposition was accepted and for two days the Indians lived high.

To-day nothing remains of Camden in the way of buildings. A portion of the old brush dam stays in the river; but everything and everybody else has moved away.

The seventieth birthday of S. S. Strohm was very appropriately celebrated at his residence on Sam Hill last Saturday. There were a number of invited guests present besides all the children and grand children excepting Frank and Roy Strohm. Mr. Strohm was presented with a fine cane and was remembered by gifts from his absent sons.

## DIED.

STROHM—In this city, Saturday, May 16, 1903, Samuel Strohm, aged 73 years.

Samuel Strohm was born in Welland county, Canada, March 17, 1830, being the next youngest of a family of eight children. In December, 1854, he was married to Miss Sarah Stringer and from this union there were eight children. The wife, three sons and three daughters survive the deceased.

Much of Mr. Strohm's life was spent on the frontier. Moving from Canada to Iowa at an early day he lived there a few years, was in advance of the railroads in the young State of Nebraska, and later on was among the first settlers in Northeastern Colorado. Mr. Strohm first came to Washington in 1886, returning to Colorado for a time, and moving to Dayton with his family in 1888, since which time he has made his home here. On Saturday, May 9, Mr. Strohm was stricken with paralysis while at work in the garden and he had only momentary flights of consciousness from that time until the end. The funeral service was held at the family residence Sunday afternoon. Interment being made in the Dayton cemetery.

The Misses Lulu Strohm, Lulu Hubbard, Delia Thompkins and Joanna Bishop arrived Thursday from the State Normal School at Ellensburg to spend their holiday vacation at their homes.

Washington, eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Strohm, died at Haxtun, Col., Tuesday. The telegram announcing his death, coming as it did without a word of previous warning, was a severe blow to the family and Mrs. Strohm is still quite prostrated by the shock. 15 June 1889.

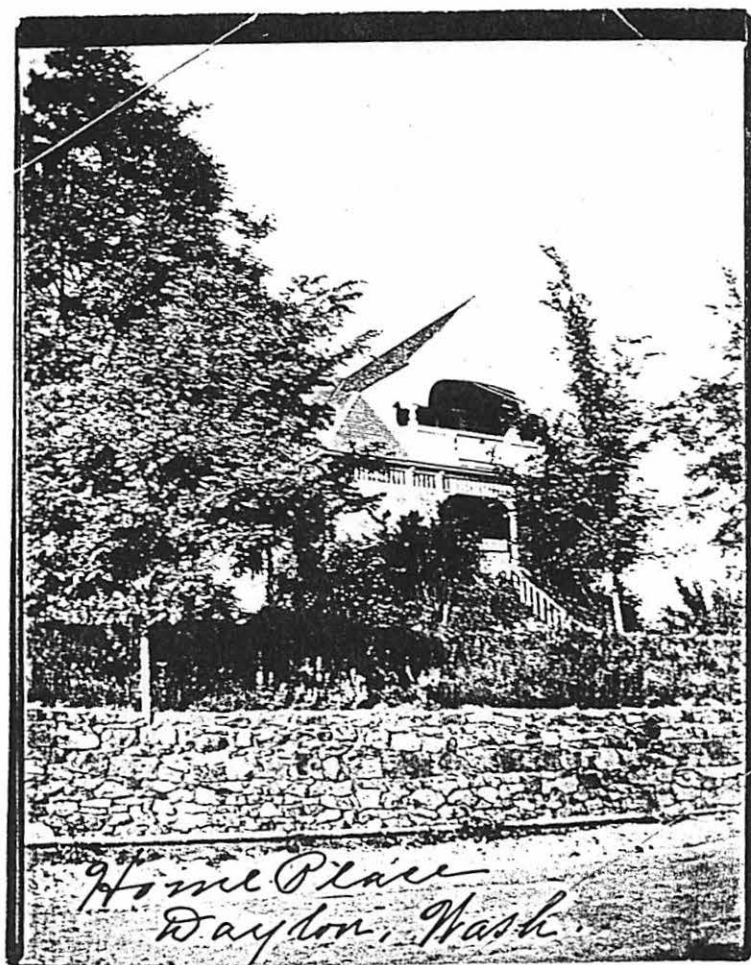

Dear Jarvis and Molly:

Thought it was about time I wrote to you and let you know how things are going. As you can see, my daughter has an e-mail address and you can get hold of me through it if you have e-mail. It is fun. Have been in touch with my sister, Rita, in Oklahoma and it sure is much easier than sending it by regular mail.

Mom and I had a real nice vacation and were able to spend some time with friends and relatives on the way. We spent three nights in Idaho. One night with an aunt of my cousins. Her name is Fern McKague. Then one night with an old friend of my Dad, Lawrence Lineberger in Homedale and the third night with my cousin, Patricia who lives in Meridian. Her mother was my Dad's older sister. She was only a baby when her mother, Alberta, died. Then we went on to Dayton, Washington. We spent 2 nights in Walla Walla, but spent time with the Bamford cousins, one of whom is Mae Huwe. She was down there with her husband visiting her brothers and they showed me Dayton. I spent some time in the courthouse, the cemetery and the library. Got some good information, plus a copy of Grandma Alma's marriage certificate to a Frank Herndon and a copy of their divorce. She married him in September 1905, but he left her right after the wedding. I guess it was a shotgun wedding, as about three or four months after the wedding, she had her daughter Alberta. In 1909, she applied for the divorce and it was final in 1911. I still have not figured out how she met Grandfather Hugh Travis, but Fern McKague, when we visited her in Idaho, had the story that one day, Grandma Alma went into a Post Office in Homedale, Idaho looking for Hugh Travis and he had gone into the same Post Office looking for her. I am wondering if they had corresponded by mail as they did not know what each other looked like, until they met at the Post Office. But according to records, Grandma Alma and Grandfather Hugh were married in 1914. I do not know if it was in Dayton, Washington, as Grandmother had in the Bible or in Homedale, Idaho. She would never talk much about that time. Mae Huwe, gave me the name of Lee Bamford and his wife. I guess that she has

done a lot of the genealogy about that family. Mom and I were able to visit her and get some information. If you have her address, she has some things on your mother, Grace. Also some old letters that your mother wrote. They were quite interesting. I gave her your address and she may have already been in touch with you, I don't know. We also visited with my cousins Carmine and Barbara in Vancouver, Washington for three days. On one of those days, while we were in that area, Mom and I took a drive down to Falls City, Oregon, and got the name of a man who is doing the history of that town. It is very small, and could not get hold of him, so I called him when we got home and he gave me the name and phone number of a cousin. Her grandmother and my Grandfather Hugh Travis, were brother and sister. I finally got hold of her last week, and sent her some information that I had on that family. I am going to send you what I have that I received on the Bamford and Williams family. Mom and I spent a couple days in Shelton, Washington with some old friends and then we left to go through Victoria, Canada, Vancouver, Canada, Kamloops, Canada, and Calgary, Canada. Then we came back home through Montana and Idaho. Had a nice time, but I came back home tired and with a bad cold, almost ending up with pneumonia. Am over it and have been back to work. I am still living with my daughter, Frieda and her family. We are all doing well together and so is Mom. Have to go now. Will be in touch.

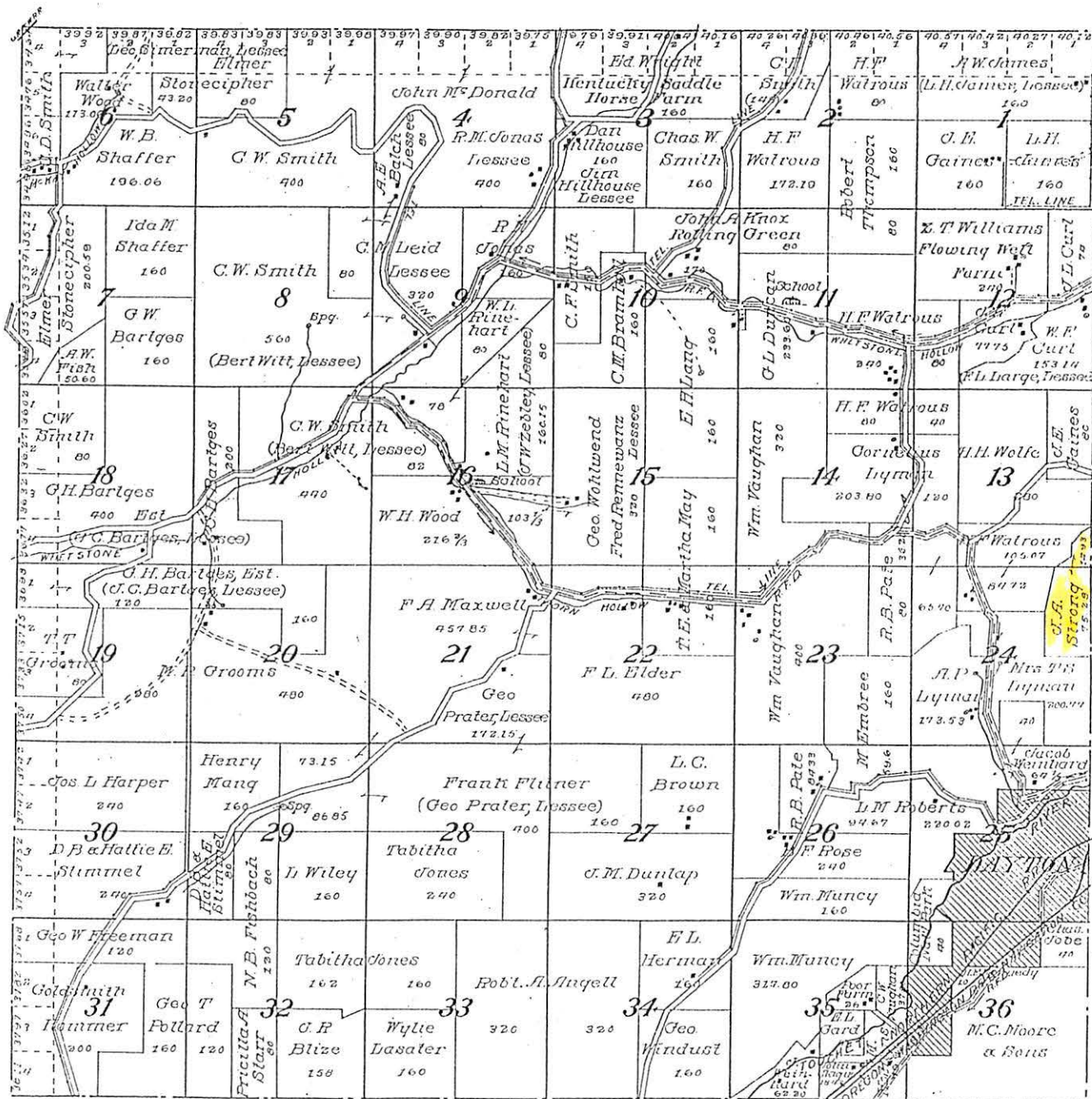

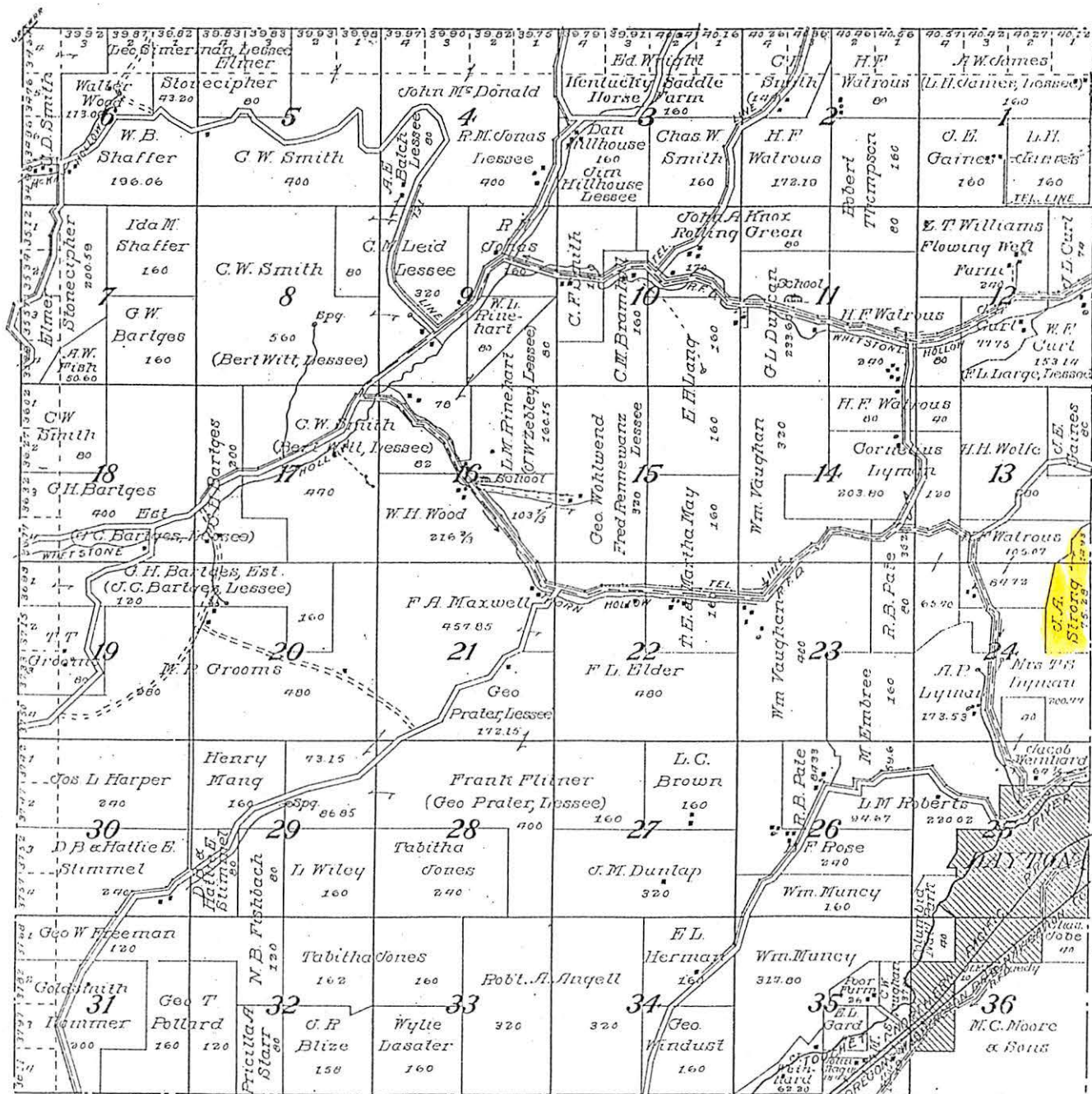
